The mission of **Sequoia Village** is to enable its members to continue living in their homes and communities as they age by providing access to support services.

DID YOU KNOW: Recology, our local trash pickup company, will pick up used batteries that are sitting on top of your blue recycling bin in a clear plastic Ziploc bag. Also, your mailman will bring your mail to the front door if you request it from the city post office where you live. And there's more: Sequoia Village volunteers will fetch boxes and other heavy items form your attic/basement, and they'll return them when you're through going through them. Volunteers will also flip your mattresses as needed.

BY THE NUMBERS

Sequoia Village now has 105 members and 75 active volunteers serving in various parts of the organization. By the way, 21 of those volunteers are members also!

In December our volunteers delivered 113 services to members. Overall, since July 1st, there have been over 600 services provided, of which 67% were transportation, and 15% were home repairs. Recently, we've added the Home Safety Evaluations, a service that we highly recommend.

Who's at the other end? ... Presently, we are in the process of interviewing for a part-time Administrator. Until the right person is found we are fortunate to have a number of warm, caring volunteers who perform the office duties and are dedicated to serving the needs of our members. In future newsletters we'll highlight those office volunteers so you can get to know them better. In the meantime, they'll be there to help when you call.
